

Northern Connector Program Visits Mount Allison

Matthew Berrigan attended Mount Allison University at the beginning of October to network and connect with students, and recent graduates from Mount A. The connections made were beyond our expectations. Matthew made over 25 connections with students and newcomers who are looking to connect with Community Leaders and Business Leaders to enhance and expand their professional networks in hopes of securing meaningful employment in their desired industry.

This informal networking is as simple as having a cup of coffee and a chat. The business or community leader then offers three more contacts to the students. These introductions and networking meetings help students and newcomers build their professional network – increasing their chances of finding meaningful employment locally and putting roots down in our community with Connections (students and newcomers) have found jobs in their respective fields and/or have gained skills and knowledge as a direct result from these meetings.

The Connector Program isn't new; it is already based and operational in 39 communities across Canada (plus 4 in the United States of America and 2 in the United Kingdom). The Connector program has an excellent track record. One out of every three students/newcomer receives employment as a result of the Connector Program. (The stats are more favourable in Nova Scotia). Overall, it is a successful model that helps local communities retain talent, engage employers, and create a more welcoming community overall.




